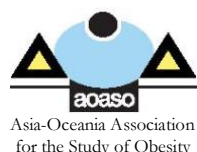

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MINUTES OF THE MASO EXTRAORDINARY GENERAL MEETING (EGM) 2021

Date and Time : 12th August 2021 (Thursday) at 5.00 p.m.

Place : Virtual (Zoom Meeting Platform)

Attendance

The EGM was attended by 45 voting members (attendance list is as shown in **Appendix 1**). The President, Emeritus Prof. Dr. Mohd Ismail Noor, called the meeting to order at 5.30 pm after the quorum (at least twice the number of council) as stipulated in the Rules of MASO was achieved.

Agenda 1: Welcome Address by the President

On behalf of MASO 15th Council, Emeritus Prof. Dr. Mohd Ismail Noor thanked the members for their presence virtually and support to enable us to achieve the quorum and welcomed them to the MASO EGM 2021. Emeritus Prof. Dr. Mohd Ismail Noor informed members that the main focus of the EGM is to once again table the amendments of the Rules of MASO that were discussed and adopted in the last 27th Annual General Meeting (AGM) on 10 December 2020. The need for this EGM was due to the rejection to the amendments by the Registrar of Societies (ROS), Malaysia. The main reason for the rejection was merely due to technical glitch in the ROS website and that the amendments were not submitted on time in lieu of the current pandemic situation. Emeritus Prof. Dr. Mohd Ismail Noor hoped that ROS will consider and approve the amendments following a resubmission, after the conduct of this EGM.

Agenda 2: ROS criteria for constitution amendments' approval

Assoc. Prof. Dr Geeta Appannah, Hon. Secretary MASO went through the sequel of events that happened in her first attempt of submitting the amendments to the ROS via their website (www.eroses.gov.my) and informed members that the ROS charges a minimal fee of RM10 for every count of constitution changes. Prior to the Covid 19 pandemic, the fee is usually paid at the ROS counters but with the pandemic situation and movement control order, Assoc. Prof. Dr Geeta Appannah could not make it to the counters. At the same time, there were no options for online payment in the ROS website until 8th July 2021. However, by that date, the requirement to submit any amendments in less than 60 days from the AGM date by the ROS has passed hence, the application to amend Rules of MASO were rejected. Upon an advice from one of the ROS officer, this EGM was planned. The amendments approved by the EGM will then be resubmitted to ROS within 28 days

Agenda 3: Amendments in MASO Rules and Bye-Laws from the previous 27th AGM

Assoc. Prof. Dr Mohd Razif Shahril, Hon. Asst. Secretary MASO went through the amendments that were adopted during the 27th AGM on 10 Dec 2020 (Appendix 2). In brief, all 18 proposed amendments were adopted by more than a two-thirds majority of the voting members present at the AGM were

presented during the EGM (Appendix 3). There was no objection from any of the members who attended the EGM and the amendments were unanimously adopted.

The meeting was adjourned at 6.15pm with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
